<p>BIG IDEAS</p>	<p>As Readers we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Study the Shakespeare’s ‘Macbeth’ using prediction and inference skills through active story telling • Use film and text from Harry Potter to make comparisons • Make links between the themes of tragedy and victory found in Shakespeare’s work using writers such as J. K. Rowling and J.R.R. Tolkien. Our key texts will be Harry Potter and the Philosophers Stone by J.K Rowling and the Macbeth play script by Shakespeare. <p>As Performers we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn the witches poem from Macbeth by heart • Perform scenes from Macbeth and our own scenes inspired by Macbeth and Harry Potter <p>As Writers we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Analyse styles of writing and imaginative description. • Be inspired by the events in Macbeth to produce writing for different purposes, e.g. emotive letters from the perspectives of characters in the play • Develop the skills of spelling, punctuation, grammar and presentation <p>As Mathematicians we will learn about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Measurements when creating potions for both Macbeth and Harry Potter • Position and direction vocabulary when directing Harry around Hogwarts using the Marauders map 		<p>As Scientists we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explore properties of materials • Investigate light • Understand forces and magnets <p>As Musicians we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improvise and compose music • Listen with attention to detail to a variety of styles of music, in particular focusing on classical pieces used in Harry Potter and compare to other classical pieces used to create atmosphere in Macbeth • Use and develop and understanding of musical notations • Perform with increasing accuracy and skill <p>As Artists we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use experiences, other subjects across the curriculum and ideas as inspiration for artwork • Develop and share ideas in a sketchbook and in finished products • Improve mastery of techniques, in particular watercolours for examples using washes <p>As Coders and users of technology we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use logical reasoning to explain how a simple algorithm works, detect and correct errors in algorithms and programs • Use technology responsibly, securely and safely
